



## Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School



Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools.
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools.
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. ### BYOD

### Save the Date - BYOD Online Information Session

Week 9, Tuesday, September 3, 6pm, Jindalee State School's eLearning Team will be providing an online BYOD Information Session for all families with students in Years 2 – 6 in 2025. This information session will be presented through the use of Microsoft Teams and a week prior to the session, parents/ carers will receive an emailed invitation with the required Teams link. Please ensure you RSVP to this email invitation. Our information session will cover...

• the basics of our BYOD program,

- the eLearning Team and what we offer,
- expectations,
- minimum device specifications,
- the BYOD Student Participation Agreement,

#### Laptop Battery Health

Is your child's BYO device lasting as long as it needs throughout the school day? A common issue at this time of the school year is laptop battery life.

There are a number of reasons why a BYO laptop's battery isn't lasting throughout the day. Some of the possible reasons include battery 'memory', age, mis-calibration etc. Below are some basic steps that can be taken to strengthen the life of your child's laptop battery.

At least once per week (weekends are best) completely drain the laptops power. To do this you will need to use the laptop until it turns itself off, due to what it thinks is it's low battery point. Turn the laptop on again (you may need to do this a few times) until it will not turn on at all.

Once the battery is fully drained, it is time to fully charge the laptop's battery but ensure there are no interruptions to this charging process. By using this process, the battery loses its power 'memory'; where it thinks it no longer has enough power to operate. It also helps the system recalibrate the battery's charge indicators.

If your child's laptop continues to have battery issues, it is important to have an IT professional assess the laptop as it may need to be replaced and this is a cheaper option than needing to purchase a new laptop.

#### QParents

Have you noticed your QParents app now displays your child/ ren's school events? Our staff have now begun transiting to QParents for our excursion dates and the initial feedback from our families has been very encouraging.

Over the next two terms, we plan to trial digital excursion permission forms via QParents Consent module (like the Media Consent and the Online Services Consent surveys) but not for all events; we want to iron out as many technical issues as possible before we implement this fully in 2025. A majority of our excursion permission forms will continue to be paper-based but for the trial digital permission forms, your child's classroom teacher will inform you if a digital permission form will be pushed out to QParents.

You will notice that all testing sessions will be <u>after</u> school, on either Tuesday or Wednesday afternoon in the Conference Room (above the administration). To support your child/ren please ensure they have a suitable snack for an afternoon tea on the balcony.



In preparation for these tests, it is essential your child/ren have their BYO device with the Janison Replay Locked-down Browser installed. Also, make

sure your child/ren know their MIS ID (school username) and unique password.


#### Cake Competition and Donations



### QSchools

In Term 2 2024, many features within QSchools were migrated to QParents. As a result, as of the beginning of Term 2 2024, the QSchools is no longer available or being updated.

### QParents

QParents is a user-friendly portal accessible via app or web browser, providing parents with secure online access to information about their child's state schooling.



QParents allows you to access and manage information online about your child.

You can access and update information about:

- attendance details
- timetables and upcoming events
- report cards and assessments
- invoices and payment history
- student medical conditions
- contact details (including addresses)

To register, you will need:

- your unique invitation code sent to you by your child's school
- an active email account
- each child's EQ ID number
  - Your child's EQ ID number can be located on an invoice you have received from us. It appears next to their name.
- 100 points of ID to verify your identity.

### School Procedures

### **Before School Routines**

Before school routines have been refined to ensure that students are ready to learn by prioritising a calm and settled start to the school day.

Please ensure that children arrive at school with sufficient time to prepare for the day. Students should arrive by 8:45 am but not before 8:15 am as there is no supervision. Parents/Carers are encouraged to access the School-Aged Care Program if early drop offs or late picks ups are required, information about this can be found here: http://www.jindaleesacp.com.au/.

If students do arrive *before 8.15am* they are to make their way to the *silver tables and chairs outside the office* where they are required to *sit and wait*.

To ensure the safety of all students, a member of the Jindalee SS Executive Team may contact parents/carers regarding any early arrivals. The duty teacher will collect students at 8:15am to move to the Year 4 Eating shed/Central shed where they will sit until 8:30am.

## At 8:30am students move to their year level designated areas as pictured below:

#### During this time the expectations for students are:

- Seated on chair, ground or on yarning mats not walking around
- Reading books or talking in social groups is encouraged
- No handballs/balls/games
- No toys to be played (or brought to school)
- Devices/Mobile phones are away (in bags)
- Raise hand to gain permission for toilet and/or drink of water (independently or with a buddy)

#### When the bell rings at 8:50am:

- Students line up in your designated year level location
- Make sure you are behind the witches hat with your class label on it
- Your teacher will collect you from this location

### The Stop, Drop & Go Zone

The zone is open in the mornings from 7am-9am and in the afternoons from 3:10pm – 3:30pm. It is a no standing zone from 2:30pm until 3:10pm - in the afternoon this zone will have traffic cones closing it until 3:10pm.

Why? – The official pick up zone is located on Wongaburra Street because it provides vehicles a safe place to collect children that is not on the main road, away from passing cars and buses. The Wongaburra zone does not open until 3:10pm in the afternoons, because all the children do not arrived at the zone until this time. Previous trials have found the zone only works when all children are present, otherwise cars park and wait, which blocks the zone until their child arrives.

#### How to use the Stop, Drop & Go Zone

- 1. Please have your children ready to go, with their bags. Parents should not leave their vehicle during pickup or drop off. You should not be packing children's bags or doing their hair in the zone. Please be as quick as possible to keep traffic moving.
- 2. Please obey the "NO RIGHT TURN" signs entering the zone and leaving the zone. If you travel along Wongaburra St from Curragundi Rd please drive all the way to the end of Wongaburra St and do a u-turn at the intersection with Mt Ommaney Dr. Do not turn right into the zone or perform a u-turn into the zone at Jenee St. These actions are unsafe and illegal.
- In the afternoons, please do not arrive until after
   3:10pm. Plan to arrive at 3:15pm or even 3:20pm.
- 4. Please move as far forward in the zone as possible and keep moving up until your child approaches the vehicle to get in. Make space in the zone to avoid traffic backing up along the road.
- 5. The 'No Parking Zone' directly outside the Prep buildings is used for cars to move out of the flow of Wongaburra St traffic and join the traffic heading into the Stop, Drop & Go Zone. Please do not queue here before 3.10pm.
- 6. Please listen to direction from school staff and police. If your child is not present at the zone, then leave and return later.
- 7. Consider parking away from the school in Curragundi Road, Arrabri Avenue or Mt Ommaney Drive. If your children are too young to walk alone then meet them at the back gate to the oval or at the front of the school. If children are older they can walk to these locations across the school oval and utilise crossing supervisors to cross the road safely.
- 8. Please do not double park and call your child out onto the road whilst illegally parked.

### Sick Students

It is absolutely vital, that if your child is sick, they must remain at home.

#### Student Absence Notification Process

If your child is going to be absent from or late to school, please register their absence **before 9:30am**, so their attendance can be recorded correctly on our system.

To do so, please choose one of the following...

- Use the QParents app (preferred) OR
- Call the school on 3725 5777 and leave a voice message (option 1) OR
- Email absent@jindaleess.eq.edu.au

If leaving a voicemail or sending an email, please ensure you state very clearly:

- Your name and contact number
- Child/ren's name & class
- Reason for absence (ie> illness, holiday, appointment, etc)
- Duration of absence

### **Financial Procedures**


No cash payments are accepted. All payments can be made via QParents/BPoint and EFTPOS through the office payment window (Monday - Friday, 8:30am - 10:30am).

**QPARENTS** - Please refer to this section on the newsletter for further details on setting up this app.

BPOINT is an online payment system and is the preferred payment method (along with QParents). This option is accessed through an internet weblink which appears on all invoices and statements.

When making payments via BPoint from the invoice or statement, please ensure to enter each payment separately using the invoice number and amount.

Payment will not clear if entered any other way.



Please be mindful when paying via BPoint for overdue invoices, as payments may take 48 hours to register in the system. To avoid any confusion, we strongly recommend you pay before the due date. We also encourage you to take a screenshot of the receipt and email to info@jindaleess.eq.edu.au.

If you are expecting an invoice for an excursion/incursion/camp or other school related program, please check your "Junk/ Spam Folder" or search your emails for "@eq.edu.au". Invoices are emailed on the day of/or day after circulars are handed to students. If you still cannot locate the invoice and need another copy, please email us on info@jindaleess.eq.edu.au or call 3725 5777.

NB: Our system can only allocate 1 parent/carer per household to receive invoices/statements (unless your children live between parents/carers - then we can split invoices 50/50 - on request only).

2023 Student Resource Scheme have been issued to those families who have returned the SRS Agreement form. This form is only required to be filled in once for each student's attendance at Jindalee State School.

We appreciate payment of these as soon as possible.

### **Casual Position Vacant**

A casual position exists for a School Crossing Supervisor at Jindalee State School.

The hours of work for the School Crossing Supervisor may be up to 1.5 hours on any school day (Monday- Friday) in all weather conditions.



Commencement of work for the successful applicant is dependent on:

- The favourable outcome of a health assessment carried out by a qualified Medical Practitioner according to the guidelines in the "Notes for Medical Practitioner" on the School Crossing Supervisor Scheme - Health Assessment Form.
- The applicant must either hold a current Blue Card or be eligible to apply for a Blue Card to the Commission for Blue Card Services. An applicant will not be employed by the Department of Transport and Main Roads unless they meet this criterion.

Please Note – The Department of Transport and Main Roads will organise and pay for both the Medical Assessment and Blue Card for the successful applicant.
